June is a busy month, with the Army's 248th birthday and Flag Day both on June 14th, and the Coast Guard Auxiliary birthday on the 23rd. All these come ahead of our national birthday, Independence Day July 4th, when I hope you will all have an opportunity to celebrate and enjoy time with family and friends.

Fort Bragg became Fort Liberty, June 2nd. All the way back in June 1775, shortly after the Continental Congress authorized the Army of the United Colonies, the communities that would become Fayetteville drew up their "Liberty Point Resolves" a year before the Declaration of Independence. They declared their willingness to fight for liberty and freedom from Britain; Army BG(ret) Ty Seidule called liberty "the greatest American value" in last year's naming commission. Then on Jun 13th, Fort Polk will become Fort Johnson, in honor of Sgt. William Henry Johnson, of the 369th "Hellfighters of Harlem" Infantry Regiment, and the first American to receive France's Croix de Guerre (War Cross) for valorous service in World War I. In 2015 he was awarded the U.S. Medal of Honor (posthumously).

Help MOAA Save New Surviving Spouses From an Unexpected Financial Burden. By Jen Goodale.

Bipartisan, bicameral legislation designed to ease the burdens faced by new surviving spouses of military retirees was reintroduced and rebranded this month, giving members of the 118th Congress a chance to protect grief-stricken family members from unwelcome financial surprises. The Respect for Grieving Military Families Act (S. 1588 | H.R. 3232) was introduced May 11 by Sens. John Cornyn (R-Texas) and Elizabeth Warren (D-Mass.) along with Reps. John Garamendi (D-Calif) and Mark Amodei (R-Nev.). The bill, known as the Military Retiree Survivor Comfort Act in the last session of Congress, was re-titled to communicate the intent and impact of the legislation.

[Take Action: <u>Ask Your Lawmakers to Support the Respect for Grieving Military Families Act</u>]

Under DoD's current policy, the Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) recoups the final month of retirement benefits upon the passing of any retired service member. This can put surviving family members in a stressful financial position; many survivors are unaware DFAS can recoup benefits – by pulling of benefits funds out of a joint checking account, for example – without their consent.

The Respect for Grieving Military Families Act prevents DFAS from immediately recouping any overpayment of benefits and instead gives survivors the opportunity to repay the benefits over a 12-month period. It would also allow the Secretary of Defense to forgive the repayment.

"The last thing military families who are grieving should have to worry about is getting hit with a surprise bill because the Department of Defense bureaucracy miscalculated pay at the end of a retiree's life," Cornyn said. "This legislation would safeguard veterans' families from this unfair practice and allow them to rectify any overpaid retirement funds at a more appropriate time."

"Military families suffering the loss of their loved one should not be penalized for an accounting oversight, "Garamendi said." **The Department of Defense's current practice of clawing back retirement benefits deposited in joint checking accounts when a veteran dies is both callous and needless.** Our Respect for Grieving Military Families Act would finally fix this to ensure that our military families have one less worry following the loss of their loved one."

Grief-stricken survivors may forget to notify DFAS when a retiree passes, resulting in a large fund recoupment that could potentially empty a bank account and result in overdraft fees. The gradual repayment option provided by the Respect for Grieving Military Families Act is the right thing to do for our surviving spouses. Add your voice to this effort by <u>contacting your lawmakers today</u>.

<u>CONTINUING NOTE:</u> CALMOAA continues sponsoring AB46 as submitted by Assembly Member James Ramos to exempt Military Retirement Pay from California Tax. Link is <u>https://leginfo.legis-lature.ca.gov/faces/billTextClient.xhtml?bill_id=20232024oAB46</u>.

A copy of the bill may be obtained from the link above, or going to CALMOAA site. General info is this act is to add and repeal Sections 17132.9 and 17132.10 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy. This bill, for taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2024, and before January 1, 2034, would exclude from gross income retirement pay received by a taxpayer from the federal government for service performed in the uniformed services, as defined during the taxable year. The bill, for taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2024, and before January 1, 2034, would also exclude from gross income annuity payments received by a qualified taxpayer, as defined, pursuant to a United States Department of Defense Survivor Benefit Plan during the taxable year. The bill would make related findings and declarations. <u>CALMOAA strongly supports this bill, and requests that members, contact your appropriate Representatives to support this bill, due to California needs to join the other states that are providing tax relief for veterans.</u>

Other bills under consideration are the Major Richard Star Act, Planning for Aging Veterans Act, Women Veterans TRUST Act, AB 531 Veterans Housing and Homeless Prevention Bond Act of 2024, SB 73 Employment Policy: Voluntary Veteran's preference, SB 492 Veterans Pretrial Act, AB 1361 California 100% rated Veterans Real Estate Exemption Act, AB 988 Miles Hall Lifeline and Suicide Prevention Act, AB 883 Expedite Application in Department of Defense Skill Bridge program, SB 289 Prohibit DMV charging fee for Veterans who can provide a specified veteran verification form for an original or replacement identification card, and AB 718 VALVET Study of Mental Health among Women Veterans.
